Baptism of Christ

Once again I have recently spent Christmas with my brother and sister-in-law in Challock, Kent. This time in a much better state of health in spite of several visits to the doctors at my surgery since early August and two stays (November, December) at West Middlesex Hospital where I was born. The Christmas Eve service (midnight eucharist but at 10.00pm) was well attended and led by the Archdeacon of Canterbury, a very likeable young man, known to my sister-in-law who was with me in church this time. He did a good job and the service went well. He was there because Challock church lost their vicar earlier in the year and are yet to appoint a new one. Of course, we could not expect to have the Archbishop for a second year running and no doubt he chose one of the other villages in the Canterbury area to visit this time.

Today we remember the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. I do not have any recollection of my own baptism as I was a baby at the time but I do have the baptism certificate; it says that I was baptized right here in St Dunstan's Church by the then vicar, the Rev. Godfrey. I have, in fact, lived in Feltham all my life, originally in Granville Avenue and now in Sunbury Road. I have seen a considerable number of changes - sadly not always for the better.
